<u>Pictures</u>	<u>Super Sentences</u>	<u>Hidden Words</u>	<u>Backwards Words</u>
Write your words and draw a picture that helps you remember the each word.	Use each of your words in a sentence. Make sure the sentence helps to show the meaning of the word. Ex. It was <u>hot</u> outside so I didn't wear a jacket. Not acceptable: I'm hot.	Draw and color a picture. Hide your spelling words inside the picture. See if someone can find your hidden words!	Write your spelling words forwards and then backwards! Remember to write them neatly!
<u>Waterfall Words</u>	<u>ABC Order</u>	<u>Story, Story</u>	<u>Fancy Words</u>
Ex: c ca cat catc catch	Write your spelling words in ABC order. If words start with the same letter, look at the next letter.	Write a story using ALL of your spelling words. Be sure to underline your spelling words in the paragraph.	Write your words using fancy letters. Write each word twice.
<u>Three Times</u>	<u>Adding My Words</u>	<u>Syllables</u>	<u>Rhyming Words</u>
First, write each word in pencil. Then, write each word in crayon. Finally, write each word in marker.	Vowels are worth 6 points, consonants are worth 3 points. Find the value of each word: Ex: cat = 3 + 6 + 3=12	Write your words, but divide them into syllables or sounds. Light-weight	Write each of your spelling words, then write a rhyming word next to each spelling word.

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<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Magazine Words</u></p> <p>Use an old magazine or newspaper and find your words or letters that make up the words. Glue them down.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Words Within Words</u></p> <p>Write each word and then write at least two words made from that word. Example: catch = cat, hat</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Words Without Vowels</u></p> <p>Write all of your words replacing vowels with a line. Go back and see if you can fill in the vowels afterwards.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Free Choice</u></p> <p>Come up with an activity on your own. Be creative!</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Word Hunt</u></p> <p>Look in books, newspapers, or magazines to find more words with the same pattern or rule you are studying. Write them down in the categories they would belong to.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Crossword Puzzle</u></p> <p>Make a crossword puzzle with your vocabulary words. Show the answers to your puzzle.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Word Search</u></p> <p>Create your own word search with your spelling words. Show the answers to your puzzle.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Use Words in a Website</u></p> <p>A fun way to practice spelling is to use the games at www.spellingcity.com (ask an adult first!). When using the website, you will have to type in your list of words.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Code Words</u></p> <p>Come up with a code for each letter of the alphabet. Then, write your words in code. Ex: A = 🍏 B= ☘ C= ☹</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Find the Pattern</u></p> <p>Write your words and find additional words that could fit into this week's spelling pattern.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Colorful Words</u></p> <p>Write each of your spelling words. Write each letter using a different color.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Define the Word</u></p> <p>Define the unfamiliar words that are in your sort. You can either define in your own words or use a dictionary to look up the true definition.</p>
